TODAY, 25 NOVEMBER, IS **INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PROTEST AGAINST VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN.** THIS MARKS THE START OF AN ANNUAL 16-DAY LONG GLOBAL CAMPAIGN TO SHINE A LIGHT ON ALL FORMS OF VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN THAT PERSIST IN FIJI, THE PACIFIC AND ACROSS THE GLOBE.

WHAT IS THE 16 DAYS OF ACTIVISM?

The 16 Days of Activism Against Violence Against Women runs from 25 November to 10 December each year. This international campaign was conceived in 1991 during the first Women's Global Leadership Institute at Rutgers University, New Jersey in the United States.

FWCC Coordinator Shamima Ali was one of 23 women leaders from around the world who attended the institute and founded the campaign at Rutgers that year. Participants chose the dates in order to symbolically link violence against women (25 November) and human rights (10 December) and to emphasise that violence against women is a gross violation of human rights.

In Fiji and the Pacific, 16 Days has not only put the focus on the continuing violation of women's human rights, it has also played a significant part in the movement for democracy, rule of law and human rights.

6 DECEMBER: White Ribbon Day to commemorate the Montreal Massacre

9 DECEMBER: International Anti-Corruption Day **10 DECEMBER:** International Human Rights Day

OVER THE PAST 10 MONTHS (JANUARY – OCTOBER 2019) 7 WOMEN HAVE LOST THEIR LIVES DUE TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

JANUARY 2019

▶ 35 year old of Nasinu - was allegedly burnt by her husband resulting in her death.

JUNE 2019

➤ Seini Tagilala, 23 of Suva – was pregnant when she was allegedly assaulted by her partner which led to her death in Hospital.

► Salanieta Leba, 19 of Nausori – was punched and stabbed allegedly by her partner and was pronounced dead on arrival at the Hospital.

JULY 2019

▶ Jennifer Downes, a Foreign National working in Suva was murdered allegedly by her husband.

AUGUST 2019

▶ Saleshni Devi, 35 of Labasa, was stabbed several times allegedly by her husband with a cane knife resulting in her death.

▶ Amelia Mafi, 36 of Suva, was stabbed allegedly by her husband at her workplace resulting in her death

SEPTEMBER 2019

▶ Maria Tauvavu, 19 of Nabitu Settlement, was found lying motionless with visible injuries at the Bilalevu Side of Sigatoka River. Her 24 year old partner Joji Katzuky who was wanted for questioning in relation to her murder was found dead apparently due to suicide.

What's wrong with toys of violence?

- They desensitise children to the results of violence · pain, mairning, crippling and death;
- They endorse violence as a way of solving problems;
- They do not develop reasoning or verbal skills;
- They require no imagination or creativity. A pull of a trigger or push of a button takes care of problems;
- They reverse the positions of good and bad values: they downgrade patience, compassion and the spirit of co-operation, while upgrading quick-trigger responses, aggressiveness and hate:
- Many of the toys equate survival with attacking, winning and being dominant. In actuality, survival may depend upon compromise, give-and-take and co-operation.
